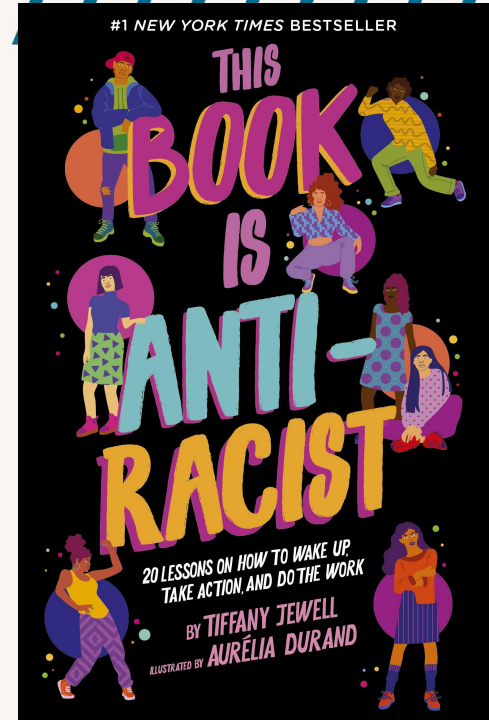

Take a few minutes to do this activity

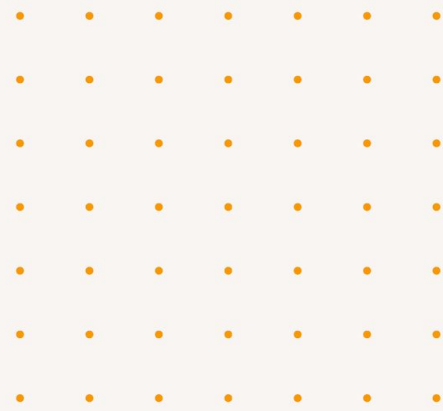
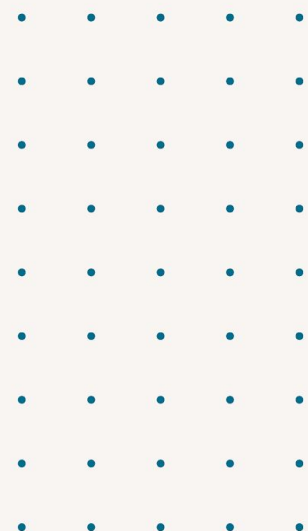
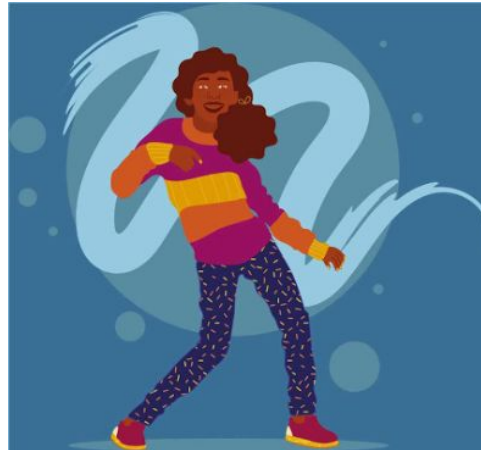
1. **Open the provided Google Doc journal on Google Classroom**
